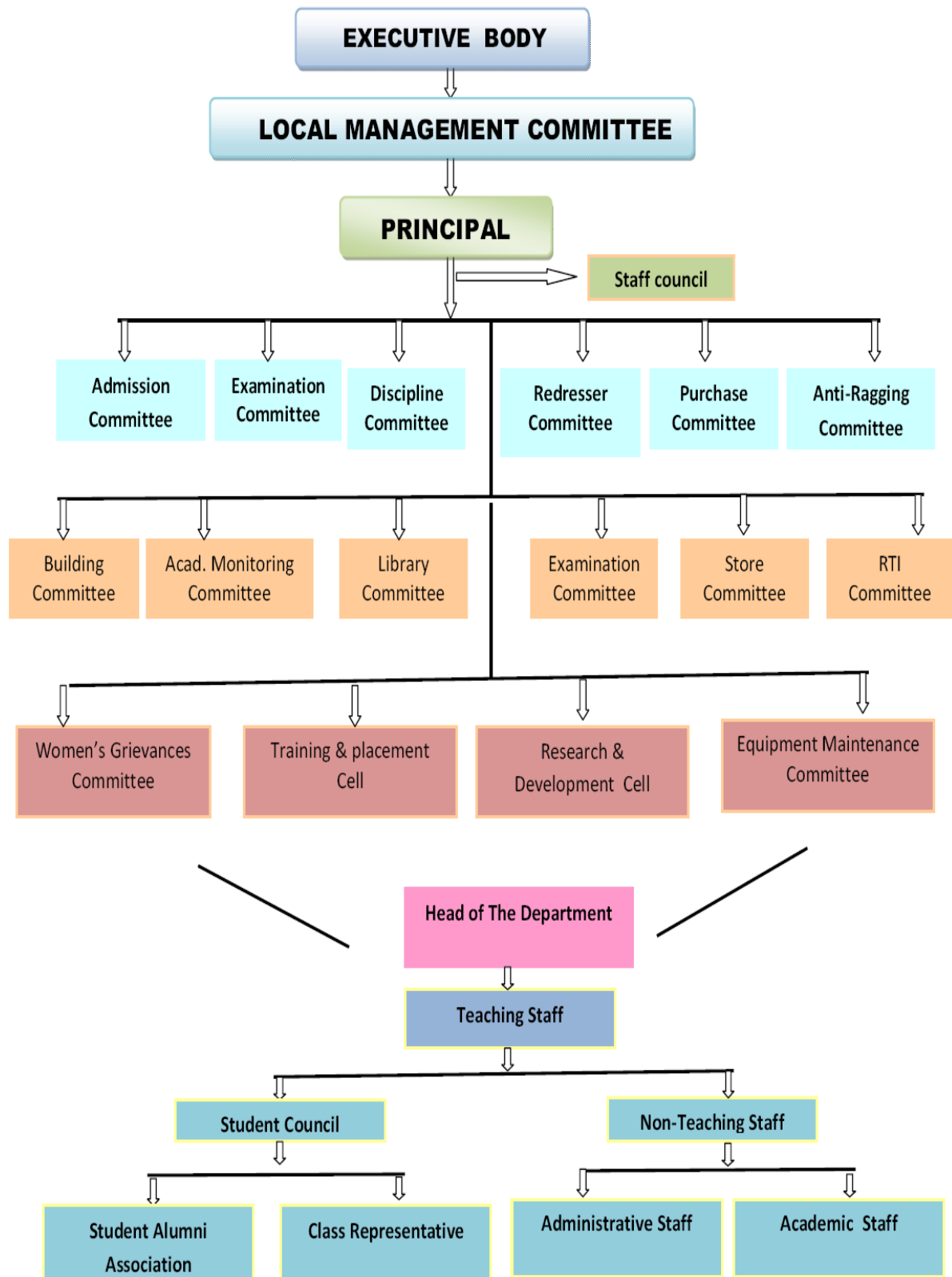

### 6.0 QUALIFYING EXAMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

6.1 For Maharashtra State Candidate (65% CAP Quota)

6.1.1 Candidate should have passed (1) higher secondary (HSC) std. XII examination of the Maharashtra State Board of secondary and higher secondary education or its equivalent examination with English as one of the subject and Physical, Chemistry and Biology/Mathematics and secured minimum 45% marks (40% for backward class candidates for Maharashtra State only) in Physics, Chemistry and the subject of maximum marks amongst the 2 subject Biology/Mathematics Biotechnology added together and

6.1.2 Appeared for Maharashtra Common Entrance Test (MHTCET) conducted by competent authority every year & obtained non zero score in the subject Physics, Chemistry & Bio/ Math in MHTCET

6.2 Eligibility criteria for OMS candidate (15% CAP Quota)

- 6.2.1 Basic qualification as specified in rule no 6.1.1
- 6.2.2 Appeared and qualified in MHT-CET conducted by competent authority as 6.1.2

**6.3 DISTRIBUTION OF SEAT**

**Distribution of seats for academic year 2016-17 will be as follows -**

- a) Institute Level Seats - 20% of sanctioned intake (for MS and OMS)
- b) CAP Seats - 65% of sanctioned intake (For Maharashtra State candidate)
  - (Home University -70% of 65% seats and other than home university 30% of 65% seats)
- c) CAP Seats - 15% of sanctioned intake (for OMS and Seats)

6.3.1 Eligibility for admission against 15% seats above intake capacity for Foreign Nationals/Foreign Students /PIO/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries .

6.3.1.1 Basic qualification as specified in rule 6.1.1 (Expert eligibility for B.C. candidates) Admission under this category will be done only after getting approval from AICTE, New Delhi

6.3.2 Eligibility criteria for J & K migrant candidate

6.3.2.1 Basic qualification as mentioned in 6.1.1 Except eligibility of B.C. Candidate

**6.4 TYPE OF CANDIATURE**

Types of Maharashtra State Candidates and Home Universities:

A candidates is considered eligible for admission to the seats of Maharashtra State coming under the purvies of competent authority subject to fulfillment of any one of the eligibility requirements as listed in the following table.

**6.5 DIRECT SECOND YEAR B. PHARM ADMISSION:**

For the direct second year B. Pharm admission candidate should have passed the (Post SSC/Post HSC) Diploma in Pharmacy (D. Pharm) from Maharashtra State of other state from as institute approved by Pharmacy Council of India scoring minimum 45% marks (40% marks in case of candidate of backward class belonging only to Maharashtra State) form institution approved by AICTE. The admission of such candidate of such candidate shall be subject to eligibility being granted by the University affiliating the admitting college.

**7.0 RESERVATION IN SEATS**

7.1 Seats are reserved for Backward class candidates from Maharashtra State as given below :

- a. Schedule caste & Schedule caste converted to Buddhism -13.0%
- b. Schedule Tribes including those living outside specified areas -7.0%
- c. Vimukta Jati (14 as specified) -3.0%
- d. Nomadic Tribes (NT1) (28 before 1990 as specified) -2.5%
- e. Nomadic Tribes (NT2) (Dhangar as specified) -3.5%
- f. Nomadic Tribes (NT36) (Vanjari specified) -2.0%
- g. Other backward Class -19.00%

- 7.1.1 Candidates claiming to belong to categories e,f. and g above will have to furnish certificate for current year from appropriate authority that the candidates does not belong to creamy layer as per the relevant order of Government. Further it is clarified that if any of the a to g categories mentioned above does not get the required number of candidate for the percentage laid down the seats remaining vacant shall be fillied in from among the candidate of remaining categories with reference to inter merit of all candidates belonging to reserved categories. However the total reservation shall not exceed 50 percent. After doing so the seats remaining vacant shall be filled with reference to inter se merit of all the candidates.
- 7.1.2 Candidate claiming to belong the category of schedule Cast /Schedule case converted to Buddhism /ST/VJ/NT1/NT2/NT3/OBC shall produce certificate or caste validity issued by appropriate scrutiny committee in the prescribed form or as laid down by the Government.
- 7.1.3 Application received without cast validity certificate shall not be considered as application for reserved category
- 7.2 Five percent seats are reserved for children of Defence service personnel and Ex. Defence personnel permanently disabled or killed in action and the distribution of these seats between defence and Ex Defence personnel shall be in the ration of 2:3
- 7.0.1 Out of the seats so reserved 60% seats are meant for children of ex defence service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra and 20% seats be reserved for children of active defence personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State
- 7.3 One percent seats are reserved for Physically handicapped students. The candidate will be required to be certified by the Director All India Institute of Physically handicapped Mumbai of civil Surgeon in the prescribed form certifying candidates physical disability and his/her ability to undergo all parts of syllabus of theory , practical etc for pharmacy course. The admission of such candidate shall be given strictly on inter se merit of the physically handicapped students.
- 7.4 Five percent seats are reserved for Marathi speaking community students from Mauritius students claiming against this category have to produce certificate from India High Commission in Mauritius to the effect that the applicant are from Marathi speaking community in Mauritius. Application should be submitted to the Director of Technical Education Mumbai.
- 7.5 Fifteen percent seats of intake capacity will be the Management Quota students will be admitted in this category on the basis of merit of the students applying in the category.
- 7.6 Certain seats shall be reserved for nominees of the agencies authorized by minister of Human Resources Development Dept of India as may be agreed by the State Govt every year.
- 7.7 30% seat are reserved in all above category for female candidates as per the provision in Govt, Resolution No. GEC-1000/(123/2000)/Tech Edu/ dated 17<sup>th</sup> April 2000. As per Govt. Resolution no Sankirna 2003/(139/2003)/Tanshi -1 dated 16-04-2003

## 8.0 **ADMISSION**

- 8.1 Seats available for admission through CAP Round
- 8.1.1 65% seats of intake capacity will be filled through central admission process (CAP) from Maharashtra State candidate's eligibile as specified in rule 6.1.1 and 6.1.2 These



admission will be done by competent authority the Director of Technical Education (DTE) Mumbai or his nominee

- 8.1.2 15% seats of intake capacity will be filled for candidates eligible as specified in rule 6.2.
- 8.1.3 20% seats of intake capacity will be filled by the Principal under institute level seats Candidate seeking admission under these seats shall submit application directly to the Principal. Candidates who are eligible as specified in rule 8.2 can apply for admission in this category
- 8.1.4 15% seats over and above the sanctioned intake will be filled from candidates eligible as per rule specified in 6.3.1 students should directly apply to the Principal for admission under this category 1/3 of the 15% seats shall be reserved for Indian works in the gulf countries.
- 8.1.5 Centralized Admission Process
- 1) The Unaided Private Professional Education Institution shall candidates through the Centralised Admission Process as referred in sub section (3) of section 3 of the Maharashtra unaided private professional, educational institution
    - a) Display or publishing of information Brochure by the Competent authority
    - b) Filling Online Application form by candidate for participation in the Centralized Admission Process
    - c) Confirmation of Online Application form and documents verification at FC by the candidates in person
    - d) Display or publishing of Provisional merit list submission of grievances if any and display or publishing of final merit list
    - e) Display of available categorywise seats for CAP rounds I,II and III
    - f) Filling up and confirmation of online option form haven preference of courses and institutions before CAO Round I Candidates may fill in choices of institutes and courses in decreasing order of their preference as pacified by Competent Authority the option form option form once confirmed shall be considered for allotment in CAP round I,II and III
    - g) Display of Provisional Allotment of CAP round I,II and III indicating allotted institute and course
    - h) Reporting and accepting the offered seat will be as per the allotment of the CAO Round I,II and III by the candidate at reporting centre.
  - 2) During the CAP before accepting the allotment seat a candidate can opt to Freeze, Slide or Float the choice of academic program for subsequent round(s) if any of seat allocation as provided bellow
    - a) Freeze : Candidates accept the offered seat and the do not want to participate in any further round of seat allocation. Such candidates will not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission
    - b) Slide : Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that if admission to the academic program of higher preference is offered within the same institution they will accept it. Such candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of admission.
    - c) Float : Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that if admission to and academic program of higher preference in any institution is offered they will accept it. Else they will continue with the currently accepted academic program. Such candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of admission.

- d) For candidates who choose the float option and secures a seat of his choice of higher preference then it would automatically result in the forfeiture of the seat accepted by the candidates the earlier round.
  - e) Sliding and floating option will not be available to a candidate who is offered admission to his first choice
- 3) Conduct of CAP Round -IV
- a) The seats available for this round shall be published on the website. The candidates are allowed to fill in or edit the already filled online option form. The seats to be allotted during the course of this round shall be subject to following condition -
    - i) Before start of this round the candidates can change their option from sliding or floating to Freezing or vice -versa
    - ii) Candidates who have not been allotted any in any of the previous rounds or those who have taken and cancelled their admission in the earlier round or rejected seat and those who have freeze the admission in earlier round but are desirous of floating and sliding in this final round are eligible to participate in this round
    - iii) Candidates who have opted for floating and sliding and also applying for this round shall fill in the allotted institution in their choice list. Once the upward allotment is made the earlier allotment automatically stands cancelled.
    - iv) Sliding and floating option are not available for the seats allotted in this round
  - b) Reporting and accepting the offered seat will be as per the allotment by the candidate at reporting center
- 4) Reporting and Confirmation of admission :After final CAP round the candidates shall report to the institution finally allotted to him and confirm his admission in institution.

## **8.2 ADMISSION TO SEATS REMAING VACANT AFTER CAP ROUND AND INSTITUTE LEVEL SEATS**

Seats remaining vacant after central admission process and institute level quota seats will be filled by the Principal from eligible student

- a) All Maharashtra candidates who are eligible for admission as per the eligible for admission as per the eligibility mentioned in rule no 6.1.1 and 6.1.2
- b) Out side Maharashtra state candidates as per eligibility mentioned in rule no 6.1.1

8.2.1 Students admitted against CAP and in institute level quota will not eligible for getting any type of scholarship

8.2.2 Seats under institute level quota and seats available after CAP round will be filled after giving admission notification in the regional and local newspaper. Separate admission round will be carried out for admission in above category. Vacancy position will be notified on Notice Board and the college website [www.pwcpharmacy.edu.in](http://www.pwcpharmacy.edu.in)

- 8.2.3 Merit list will be prepared on the basis of total marks obtained in common entrance test out of 200 and marks of HSC examination in the subject Physics, Chemistry and subject of max marks out of 2 subject mentioned in 6.1.1 added together in case of tie.
- 8.2.4 No rounding of the marks secured by the candidates will be done in individual subject or grand total while converting marks of individual subject out of 100 or total marks out of 300.
- 8.2.5 In case of candidates securing equal marks their relative merit will be fixed on the basis of the following in the order of preference given below  
Candidate qualifying CET with higher marks out of 100 in the subject biology /Mathematics then Chemistry in MHT CET exam and then student passing SSC exam with higher aggregate marks out of 750 and last birth date of candidate
- 8.2.6 Candidate seeking admission can raise an objection by written complaint to the Principal if he has reason to believe that merit is not given correctly or his name is omitted. Such complaint should be lodged within given time
- 8.2.7 Admission will be done through counseling by college authority after notifying final merit list
- 8.2.8 After completion of admission process for Maharashtra State candidate remaining seats if vacant will be filled from OMS candidates as mentioned in 8.2.
- 8.3 INSTRUCTION FOR OUTSIDE MAHARASHTRA STATE CANDIDATES(OMS)**
- a) OMS candidate will be admitted in OMS category or in management quota only
  - b) OMS candidate should have passed qualifying examination within two years from year of his admission
  - c) OMS candidates will be considered only in Open category even if they belong to reserved category in their state. No relaxation is allowed in eligibility criterion
  - d) OMS candidate should produce original school /college leaving certificate of the institute last attended
